
Meeting on Common Ground

The Trustees of the American Orchid Society and its Standing Committees meet twice each year, in the Spring and in the Fall. Spring meetings are usually held in March, April, or May; Fall sessions in September, October, or November. Meetings are open to AOS members and everyone interested in orchids. Advance planning is essential to allow time to make the necessary arrangements. The event typically begins on a Wednesday and ends on the following Sunday. An orchid show is big part of the event and is usually open to the public from Friday morning until Sunday afternoon.
